The AI Governance Imperative

87% of organizations lack formal AI governance, exposing them to: - Regulatory fines (EU AI Act: up to €30M or 6% of revenue) - Reputational damage from biased AI systems - Legal liability for AI-driven decisions - Security breaches via model vulnerabilities

Sample Policy: AI Model Approval Process

Tier 1: Low Risk (e.g., content recommendations) - Automated approval - Quarterly audits - Standard monitoring

Tier 2: Medium Risk (e.g., pricing optimization) - Manager approval required - Bias testing mandatory - Monthly audits

Tier 3: High Risk (e.g., credit decisions, hiring) - Executive committee approval - Third-party audit required - Continuous monitoring - Explainability mandatory

Regulatory Landscape:

Regulation	Scope	Key Requirements	Penalties
EU AI Act	EU operations	Risk classification, documentation, human oversight	€30M or 6% revenue
GDPR	EU data subjects	Consent, right to explanation, data protection	€20M or 4% revenue
CCPA	California residents	Data rights, opt-out mechanisms	\$7,500 per violation
NYC AI Hiring Law	NYC employers	Bias audits, notice requirements	500–1,500 per violation

Risk Category	Example	Likelihood	Impact	Mitigation
Bias & Discrimination	Hiring AI favors certain demographics	Medium	Critical	Regular bias audits, diverse training data
Privacy Breach	Model leaks sensitive data	Low	Critical	Differential privacy, access controls
Model Failure	Prediction accuracy degrades	High	High	Continuous monitoring, auto-retraining
Adversarial Attack	Malicious inputs fool model	Medium	High	Adversarial training, input validation

Responsibilities: - Review high-risk AI applications - Investigate ethics complaints - Update governance policies - Approve AI principles
